
### An Update on COVID-19 in Chile

#### Updates to the Paso a Paso Plan

Considering that more than 13 million people have been vaccinated with at least one dose, the Government recently announced adjustments to its "Paso a Paso nos Cuidamos" plan that have allow for a better balance between meeting sanitary objectives and the effects of mobility restrictions on daily life. The main change considers fewer mobility restrictions for those that have been fully vaccinated, and greater flexibility on curfews, among others. In addition, schools may open during lockdowns.


These changes will take effect on Thursday July 15th. population completing the process. 2<sup>nd</sup> dose.

More than 24 million vaccines have been administered, with 74% of the target population completing the process.




Chile has received more than 26 million vaccines, mostly from SINOVAC and Pfizer-BioNTech.

Percentage of total population, Data through June 25th.







The fall in cases continues to support a gradual relaxation of mobility restricting measures; as of July 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021, roughly 3.9% of the nation's population will be in lockdown, down from above 50% a month ago.



Critical bed capacity has increased this year, yet availability remains stressed.







