## An Update on COVID-19 vaccinations in Chile

**Santiago, February 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021.** The Government of Chile's goal is to vaccinate the majority of the ~5 million people of the "at-risk groups" by the end of the first quarter of 2021, and the majority of the 15 million adult population during the first semester of 2021.

As has been highlighted in previous newsletters, the Government of Chile has reached agreements with several laboratories for COVID-19 vaccines for the entire population (~19.8 million):

- Pfizer-BioNTech: 10 million doses (double dose)
- SINOVAC: 10 million doses (double dose)
- COVAX Global Alliance: 7.6 million doses (double dose)
- Astra-Zeneca / Oxford: up to 4 million doses (double dose)
- Janssen Laboratory: up to 4 million doses (mono dose)

Of the amounts described above, as of this week, roughly 3.9 million SINOVAC doses and approximately 150,000 Pfizer-BioNTech had been received.

Additional shipments are scheduled from SINOVAC over the next few weeks, which should complete the entire 10 million doses by the end of the first week of March. Pfizer-BioNTech is expected to resume shipments to Chile next week, with around 400,000 doses during February.

Separately, in order to ensure the vaccination targets are met on schedule, the Government continues to negotiate the purchase of additional COVID-19 vaccines, including from other laboratories that have had positive results.

### Progress on Administered Doses


Regarding progress on administered doses, as of Thursday February 11<sup>th</sup> at 17hrs (SCL), 1,550,594 people had been vaccinated with the first dose, and 53,381 with the second dose.

The vaccination program has a daily calendar that is announced weekly. During the previous week, aged 85 and above, as well as healthcare workers were vaccinated. This week, vaccinations continued for people aged between 71-84 years, and workers from key functions or that are particularly exposed to contagion. The calendar for next week has already been announced and will target people of 65 years and above.
